FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What should go into the dumpster? Yard waste that typically would be raked-up and placed into bags, or otherwise burned. Because we are having a chipper come to each property and chip up branches, you might as well allow them to do so. No sense in transporting it to the dumpster yourself. No branches are too small to chip, just make sure the smaller ones are in an identifiable pile. Pine straw, leaves and wood chips are examples of materials that should be put in the dumpster.

What should be stashed on the edge of the property for the mobile chipper? Branches and trees up to 15" in diameter. If you have cut down a tree of significant size (for instance 8" in diameter and larger), please cut the trunk into a manageable-sized logs not longer than 3 feet in length.

What should you do if your property line is on a hill to the side of the road? If the edge of your property makes it difficult to store materials to be chipped, consider the opposite side of the road if feasible, or perhaps the side of your driveway if that is more suitable. Just don't create a situation where cars have difficulty traveling in front of your property.
